Day 1

Younger Explorers:

- *Who built the ark? (Noah maybe sing the song ©)
- *Was it small or big? (Note: it was 510 feet long that's 1 ½ football fields, and 50 feet high taller than a 4 story building)
- *What kinds of animals were on the ark? What's one of your favorite animals?
- *What is a Promise? (saying you'll do something, and then doing it, no matter what)
- *What is the Rainbow? (It reminds us of God's promise to never flood the earth again)

Older Explorers:

- *What is a Promise?
- *Why is it important to keep a Promise?
- *What promise did God make to Noah before the flood? (To save him and his family)
- *What promise did God make after the flood? (To never destroy the world by a flood)
- *What sign did God give to remind us of His promise? (Rainbow)
- *Does this help you trust God? How?
- *How is Jesus like the ark? (He keeps us safe from God's punishment of sin)

Day 2

Younger Explorers:

- *What are the 10 Commandments? (God's rules for how best to live.)
- *Even if we don't always like rules, why are they good for us?
- *What is one Rule we have in our family?
- *How is that good for us?
- *Why did God give the 10 Commandments? (He loves us. They show us what He is like: holy. They show us how to live life best. They show us His love for us.)
- *How good is God that He knows we can't keep the rules and sent Jesus to be our substitute? (Super-Good!)

Older Explorers:

- *How do you feel when you hear the word commandment? Do you like rules? Why or why not?
- *Why did God give the 10 commandments? (For our good. Rules just for the sake of having rules may not be good. God gives us His commandments for our good.)
- *How does it feel to know that God knows you can't keep the rules and sent Jesus to be your substitute?

Day 3

Younger Explorers:

- *What kind of people did Jesus call to follow him? (Fishermen, tax-collector, and ordinary men)
- *What did Jesus tell them they would do? (Be fishers of men)
- *Does Jesus want us to follow him?

Older Explorers:

- *What kind of people did Jesus call to follow him? (Fishermen, tax-collector, and ordinary men)
- *What did the men need to do to follow Jesus? (Trust him and go follow him. They didn't have to do good stuff or clean up their lives.)
- *What does this mean for you? Do you have to be super good to follow Jesus?

Day 4

Younger Explorers:

- *What sickness did the 10 men have? (Leprosy)
- *Why would they be sad? (They felt sick, they had to stay away from everybody else)
- *What did Jesus do for the men?
- *One sick man was different than the others in two ways. What were they? (1- he was a Samaritan; 2- he returned to tell Jesus Thank You)
- *What is something you could thank Jesus for right now? Let's tell Him! (Pray together)

Older Explorers:

- *If you had leprosy, what would be the worst part? (Discuss)
- *Do you think that was important to Jesus?
- *What did Jesus do to heal the 10 men? (He just told them to go show themselves to the priest, and on the way they were healed. He didn't have to touch them or anything!)
- *What does that tell you about Jesus' power over sickness? (He has all power.)
- *One sick man was different than the others in two ways. What were they? (1- he was a Samaritan; 2- he returned to tell Jesus Thank You)
- *What is something you could thank Jesus for right now? Let's tell Him! (Pray together)

Day 5

Younger Explorers:

- *What happened in our story today? (Have student tell you the story in their own words)
- *How could Jesus rise from the dead? (Only God could do that.)
- *Since Jesus rose from the dead and forgives all your sins, will you trust and follow Him?

Older Explorers:

- *What happened in our story today? (Have student tell you the story in their own words)
- *How could Jesus rise from the dead? (Only God could do that.)
- *If you were Peter, how would you feel about talking to Jesus after you denied Him?
- *Jesus could forgive Peter; what does that say about whether He could forgive your sins?
- *Since Jesus rose from the dead and forgives all your sins, will you trust and follow Him?
